
Thanks to all of you that turned in your CVVC show evaluation sheets and shared with us your comments and

On Sunday, June 7, the 22nd annual Minnesota Bug-In was held at Luther's Westside Volkswagen dealership in St. Louis Park. Larry and Carrie Simmons, Bob and Jackie Tudahl, and Yours Truly attended the show. None of us got much sleep prior to driving the 100 or so miles to this event because we had just returned from Effingham, Illinois at around 1:00 A.M. that same morning. In addition, I had just experienced the debacle with my 1969 Beetle, and had to tow it 500 miles home behind a 24-ft beast from Budget Truck Rental on a dolly, so I wasn't in the most jovial of moods to begin with.

Needless to say, I had no choice but to enter my 2007 factory-stock Passat in the show. I knew that no trophies would be coming home with me unless my car happened to be the only one in its class entered; thus resulting in the old "winning by default" scenario. This was confirmed rather matter-of-factly as I pulled onto the lot and one of the Minnesota club members said, "You can't park that in here! This is for show cars only!" I responded by telling him it WAS for the show, to which he replied, "Oh, okay." Nonetheless, the look on his face said it all: He's gotta be kidding, right?

It had been a while since any of us from the CVVC had attended this event. Since the Bug-In is now held on the same weekend as the Mid-America show in Effingham, this creates a bit of a conflict, but we figured that since it had been at least two or three years since we were last here, it would be a nice gesture to show up.

The skies were quite overcast and temperatures were a little cool. We arrived shortly after registration began. CVVC President Larry Simmons entered a 1963 Herbie Beetle he had recently purchased in California after he and Carrie's brother Brad flew there one way and drove the car back to Wisconsin. Vice-President Bob Tudahl entered his freshly done 1957 Custom Beetle. Incidentally, both of these respective VW's also appeared in Effingham the previous day. Unfortunately, nobody from our side of the St. Croix received any trophies.

On one of our last trips to Minnesota prior to our return in 2009, we had learned that the water-cooled

VW owners had split off from the air-cooled crowd, and this was still sadly obvious as we witnessed perhaps 4 or 5 water-cooled VW's there, and that included mine. Otherwise, the usual assortment of classic Beetles, Buses, and Ghias were on hand. Interestingly, there were a couple of VW's there that you don't see every day. A few Eurovans were converted into Class B motorhomes back in the 1990's and early 2000's by the Winnebago Company. These rather rare campers were known as Rialtas and cost around \$20,000-\$30,000 in addition to the van itself to convert during their heyday.

Once the awards were announced, we departed Luther's and soon discovered that the road construction on 394 prevented us from exiting to I-94. We each had to drive through parts of downtown Minneapolis to find our way back east. Don't ask me how, but I ended up way out by the airport before I figured out where I was!

In future years, we tentatively plan to alternate between attending the Minnesota Bug-In and the Funfest for Beetle down in Effingham; depending on what the shows will feature. Whichever destination we choose, we welcome all CVVC members to join us. Remember what they say. The more, the merrier.




